

CANAL BOAT TRIP. How does a trip on a horse drawn barge appeal to you - with the possibility of meeting one of the old boatmen who knew those 'heady' days of horse drawn barges? If the response is good enough - and I must have your replies as soon as possible - the trip is being organised for the afternoon of Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> June. The journey starts from NORBURY JUNCTION near NEWPORT in SHROPSHIRE, and if we can muster 40 people we can hire the barge for approx £1 per head. Member's wives and family are welcome to join this outing and the offer is also being extended to members and their families from outside our own Region. It is important that we get a good response and I would be obliged if you would send back the bottom portion of this Newsletter letting me know the numbers you wish to bring. Refreshments are available if required. Also, if you have any items of harness remotely connected with the waterways - please bring it along too.

TOURS OF WALSALL MANUFACTURERS. If any member would like to be conducted round the works of W. Thacker & Sons (who produce stamped harness decorations), Stanley Bros. (One of the oldest manufacturers of horse brasses and harness fittings) and H. Unfortunately these can only be done during working hours and the first one is arranged for Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> MARCH at 2pm. The second day arranged is Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> MAY at the same time. Please let me know if you would like to be included in one of these parties.

KENILWORTH SHOW. - A DISPLAY OF BRASSES BY MIDLANDS MEMBERS. I am presently exploring the possibility of Regional members - and possibly with help from other Regions, of putting on a display of brasses at the Kenilworth Show on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> AUGUST. The Show is held on the site of the ROYAL SHOW at Stoneleigh in conjunction with the Town and Country Festival. The organisers are investigating the possibility of providing us with a free covered site not less than 20ft x 20ft. in which we could mount a display of horse brasses as well as advertising the Society and running a fund-raising stall.

These are tentative arrangements so far - More details later. In the meanwhile any members interested in the idea and any suggestions would be welcomed by myself.
